This year, there are so many reasons to put the Carmel Coast on your agenda, beginning with the first-ever 2023 U.S. Women's Open to be held at Pebble Beach, July 5-9. Here, the top players in the game compete for the most coveted championship in women's golf-the 78th Annual U.S. Women's Open. Witness history with each stroke, while soaking in the beauty of The Inn at Spanish Bay, perhaps imbibing a cocktail fireside in the famed lobby lounge. Follow

August is Car Month on the Monterey Peninsula, with two events one cannot miss: the 72nd Concours d'Elegance at Pebble Beach, where the rich history of automobilia is on display, Aug. 20; and The Quail, A Motorsports Gathering at Quail Lodge & Golf Club, Aug. 18. Now in its 20th year, The Quail is the place for motorsports enthusiasts to witness the unveiling of the very latest in automotive invention, from supercar to hypercar, alongside breathtaking collections of classic gems in a garden-party setting.

The event will also highlight Bentley's early 1950s R-Type coupe, as well as a spectacular "Eyes on Giugiaro" class, penned by famed father and son designers Giorgetto and Fabrizio Giugiaro.

## PACIFIC GROVE

With its lovely collection of B&Bs, inns, antique shops and restaurants, Pacific Grove is a quaint spot to escape coastal crowds. The famed Seven Gables Inn is one of the larger properties, dating to 1883, and is listed among the 10 most romantic Inns in America. Each room has an ocean view.

## **CARMEL-BY-THE-SEA**

Carmel-by-the-Sea, a maze of high-end boutiques, pastry shops, wine-tasting rooms, cottages, inns, candy stores, antique galleries and restaurants, never ceases to entertain. No matter how many times you visit, simply duck into a flower-filled courtyard and discover a new thrill. Local wineries like **Talbott Vineyards** specialize in Chardonnay and Pinot Noir from the highly acclaimed Sleepy Hollow Vineyard. **Caraccioli Cellars** sets a new standard for méthode champenoise sparkling, sourced from Escolle Vineyard in the Santa Lucia Highlands. It can go flute to flute with the finest Champagne. Their swanky tasting room is reminiscent of a French cave.

Don't leave without enjoying hand-crafted European country cuisine, including pillow-soft Parisian gnocchi and stuffed champignons at **La Bicyclette**, also famed for its Andrew Molera pizza, with artichokes and garlic confit. Molera was the first to bring artichokes to the Monterey Peninsula on a commercial scale. There's also a State Park named for him in Big Sur. If you're truly looking to splurge, the pinnacle of indulgence is **Aubergine**, where Relais & Châteaux Grand Chef Justin Cogley and pastry chef Yulanda Santos perform culinary magic.

## **BIG SUR**

Upon entering Big Sur, a must stop is the breathtaking **Nepenthe**, a favorite of tourists and locals alike since 1949. Their Ambrosia Burger and homemade desserts will help you forget your travails while refreshing you for your remaining travels. The views alone at Nepenthe will beckon an inevitable return.

Sierra Mar at Post Ranch Inn, a pinnacle of fine dining since inception, demonstrates a new commitment to sustainability under the leadership of Executive Chef Reylon Augustin. Each diner in the party enjoys a consistent, harmonious dining experience—with a fixed share-centric menu that changes nightly, largely sourced from the on-site garden. A few dishes at a time—like diver scallop tartare with Brokaw citrus and garden fennel, and soy-braised marble potatoes with Gochujang aioli and garden nasturtium—are delivered for everyone to try. No decisions: no remorse. It's a scalable new approach to communal dining with a view beyond compare.
